- Design and create a lighthouse
- A visit to the beach
- Symmetry of sandcastles
- Create a stop motion beach scene
- Health and wellbeing – taking care of ourselves in the sun
- Mapping - our local area, identifying where beaches are on Anglesey
- Writing a poem about the beach
- Float and sink
- Temperature - compare temperature with other countries
- Sounds of the beach- experimenting with instruments
- Sea creatures
- Impact of pollution on sea creatures
